

## What is Loop Scheduling?

You have a list of subjects for your kids to do:

Math  
Language Arts  
Science  
History  
Foreign Language  
Music  
Art

Note: each kid's list will look different, so tailor the list to each kid.

OK, now let's say you want to work for 3 hours (dreaming, here!) and you can't possibly fit in all those subjects in 3 hours. So...you manage to get done with:

Math  
Language Arts  
Science  
History...and there you stop for the day.

Tomorrow, you'll pick up where you left off:

Foreign Language  
Music  
Art (now, you'll go back to the start of your list & cont from there)  
...Math  
Language Arts  
Science (now let's say 3 hrs is up, so you stop for today. Tomorrow you'll start with History, etc.)

So basically, you work for a certain time on your list of subjects. Pick up where you left off the day before. Continue through the loop until you run out of time again. You don't worry about fitting it all in, you just work until you stop.

Now there are all kinds of ways to adopt this, but here is where it gets complicated. Everyone's loop is going to look different. Some moms have subjects that they don't loop and do daily (example: they do math & language arts every day, but loop science, history, music, art, foreign language). Some moms have a list of subjects to do independently and subjects that require their attention, so that each kid is working on independent stuff while mom is busy with 1 kid, and then they swap.
